Very generic overview EHDS

- strengthens the rights of natural persons in relation to the availability and control of their electronic health data;
- lays down rules for the placing on the market, making available on the market or putting into service of electronic health records systems ('EHR systems') in the Union;
- establishes a mandatory cross-border infrastructure enabling the primary use of electronic health data across the Union;
- lays down rules and mechanisms supporting the secondary use of electronic health data;
- establishes a mandatory cross-border infrastructure for the secondary use of electronic health data.
